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Subject: Town of Stony Point, Rockland County NY- Champlain Hudson Power Express (CHPE) Proposal

Dear, Mr. Mills

I am requesting that the Department of Energy (DOE) extend the public comment period for the Champlain Hudson Power Express (CHPE) beyond the June 14, 2012 deadline. I have only recently heard about this Proposal due to the Rockland County Journal News coverage of local residents speaking about the transmission line, within the last two weeks. The Town of Stony Point has requested that CHPE come and explain their proposal. The soonest that meeting could be scheduled for is:

**June 26, 2012**

**Location: RHO Building ( Letchworth, Stony Point, NY 10986)**

**Time: 7:00 PM**

This is after the DOE comment session is closed on June 14<sup>th</sup> and 3 days before the New York State Public Service Commission's comment period closes on June 29, 2012. It appears that CHPE is not concerned with speaking with the residents of the Towns in which they plan to build on land.

No One from CHPE has been to Stony Point and explained the proposal. To be more confusing, there appears to be several different versions as to why the proposal is being developed. When our locally elected officials from the Town and County are questioned they cannot explain the proposal either. It appears that this proposal was done behind closed doors and simply announced.

This is a decision that must be carefully studied. The North Rockland School District, Towns of Haverstraw and Stony Point have already been ravaged by Deregulation. The Lovett and Bowline plants purchased by "Southern" spun off into *Mirant*, bankrupted in 2003. *Chapter 11 Case, Case No. - 03-46590-DML-11, Mirant retains the Blackstone Group L. P. as "financial advisors" (Proposed Attorneys for the Debtors and Debtors-in-Possession, Jointly Administered). July 14, 2003*

After that financially devastating experience we are faced with another Blackstone Group wholly owned subsidiary wanting to install additional utility infrastructure through our Towns and County without explaining the proposal or the impact it will have on the residents.

**I am requesting that the public comment session be held open, until a published and through public comment session can be held in Rockland County. This proposal explained to the residents of Rockland who are being asked to once again to host Utility Infrastructure that can simply be abandoned when the rate of return is not what the Blackstone Group wants it to be.**


